Mondays and Wednesdays, 8:30-10:00 am, Studio IIJ Virginia Allen, Instructor

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<u>Course Outline.</u> The Elements of Conducting is a one-semester course focusing on developing basic skills in all the important aspects of the conducting profession, including technique, score reading and analysis, principles of interpretation, rehearsal techniques, and orchestration from a conductor's point of view. The course will create conducting opportunities in an informal classroom setting.

<u>Attendance Policy.</u> You are required to attend all classes on time. Absences could affect your overall grade, and three unexcused absences will result in a failing grade, no exceptions. Please submit release requests in a timely manner. If you have a morning coaching which conflicts with class, it is your responsibility to let me know in advance.

<u>Assignments.</u> You will be prepared to conduct and discuss assigned repertoire and to complete any written assignments. *It will not be possible to make up conducting assignments that you miss.*

Instrumental Ensembles. For most of the classes, you will be your own ensemble. Thus, you will be prepared to perform assigned repertoire on your major or secondary instrument in class. Your classmates will depend on you to bring your instruments and to be on time. You will occasionally have the opportunity to conduct small ensembles of players from outside our class.

<u>Evaluation.</u> You will be evaluated at the conclusion of each conducting project. You will also be evaluated on any written assignments, as well as your participation and preparation throughout the semester.

Exams. The midterm exam on October 26 and final exam on December 14 are conducting exams with small ensembles.
